9.2. Veterinary examinations, horse inspections and passport controls will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations, Art.1011 Rules for Jumping Events, Annex VII on 20 May 2005 at 8.00 AM near the stable.

# General Regulations 21<sup>st</sup> edition, effective 2005:

#### Art. 139.1:

"Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identyfication and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2:

"Horses taking part in CSNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their own country are not required to have such a passport as mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate".

# 9.3. **Equine influenza vaccination, Vet. Regulations Annex VI** (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for the primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceeding 7 days including the day of the competition or entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

# 9.4. Sampling for prohibited substances (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex III) Regular sampling is carried out in CCI\*\*\*/\*\*\*\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. In CICs\*\*\*/\*\*\*\*, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

## 9.5. Medication Control Program (Groups I & II only).

The Organising Committees of the FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme..

#### 9.6. Approved laboratory (art. 1022).

Under the Medication Control Program (MCP) in Groups I and II (Western Europe), all samples collected in accordance with Vet.Regs.Art. 1017.1 will be analyzed by the:

#### 9.7. Health requirements for the entry of horses:

A Polish official veterinary certificate form is necessary for the entry of sports horses into Poland. It must be filled in the language of the home country and in Polish.

#### X. MISCELLANEOUS

10.1. Complaints (art.167, 169, 170 & 171)

All complaints and objections to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 150 CHF or equivalent.

10.2. Prizes classification (art. 128, 129).

The leading rider in the classification will be appointed after every competition.

10.3. General classification at the end of the competitions.

Special prizes will be warded to:

- the best rider
- the best military rider
- 10.4. Distribution of prizes and indemnities (art.130)

At least 6 money prizes will be awarded in every competition

10.5. Doctor, veterinarian, farrier (GR Art. 114.9)

A physician, veterinary surgeon and farrier will be at the area of the event 24 hours a day.

10.6. Insurances:

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses/ponies. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

10.7. Event's organization (art. 115.2)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General F.E.I. by the Foreign Judge.

10.8. Entry right to showgrounds (Art. 133)

Cards of entrance for Chefs d'Equipe, horse owners (up to 2 per horse), riders, grooms and trainers will be issued by the OC. Please specify the names of those persons in the entries. No other entry passes will be issued.

10.9. Deductions from prize money:

All prize money is subject to Polish income tax of 10%.

## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands, This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare, This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Final approval of this draft schedule by the F.E.I.in accordance with art. 115.1 denotes only that the contents conform to the FEI Statutes, General Regulations and Rules. By no means does this entail implicit acceptance of any liability of the F.E.I. for any damages to third parties caused by the Organising Committee and its officials, riders, owners and their horses.
