Veterinary Examinations, Inspections and Passport Controls

They will be carried out in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1011:

Rules for Dressage Events, Annex I.

General Regulations 20th Edition, revised 1st January 2000, will apply in accordance with Art. 139.1 horses entered for any competition at CDNs, CDIs** in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CDIs***, CDIOs**, CDIOs*** Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in a foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, accompanied by an FEI Recognition card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership in accordance with Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CDNs, CDIs* and CDIs** in their own country are not required to have such a passport as mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

Equine Influenza Vaccination, Veterinary Regulations, Annex VI:

All horses and ponies for which a FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinary who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given not less than 21 days and more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 12 months subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of the entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions, which recommended/required by the manufacturers and by National Authorities / Regulatory Authorities at intervals more frequent than 12 months.

Sampling for prohibited substances. Vet. Regs. Chap. V & VI and Annex III.
Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI's Medication Control Programme Substance. Such sampling is compulsory in CDIOs, World Cup Qualifiers, Cup Finals, Championships and Games, and is recommended for other categories of CDIs.

Under the Medication Control Programme (Group I and II only) all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 10017.1 will be analysed by the Approved Laboratory:

For events other than those listed in VR Art. 1017.1 of for events other than in Groups I and II,
Samples may be analysed at an alternative approved Laboratory (VR Art. 011 and Annex X.)

Competitors at CDIs***, CDIOs**, CDIOs*** Championships and Games must pay the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event to the Organizing Committee towards the costs of the above program.

Each horse coming from abroad needs:

An international passport from the FEI or a national passport approved by the FEI.
The carnet ATA, issued and approved by the local Chamber of Commerce.
The temporary import or export European certificate.

Attention

Since 1995 new custom regulations between EU and EFTA apply. All foreign riders are strongly requested to follow strictly the above formalities. In case papers are not in good order, horses risk to be stopped at the border.

The road-horse-boxes have to travel under transit bond direct to the stables.

The Swiss customs authorities have instructed all customs offices at the Swiss border accordingly. All costs that arise from following these instructions are for the account of the participant.

The frontier crossing points has to be put on the entry form.

No transport reimbursement is paid.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

Services

All expenses incurred (in particular veterinarian, farrier etc.) will have to be paid by the responsible person of the horse.

Objections (GR.Art. 167-171)

To be valid, any objection must be presented to the President of the Ground Jury in writing and accompanied by a deposit of an amount equivalent to CHF 150.00.

Prize – Classification

The winner and all the placed horses of each competition will get a stable plate and a rosette. The winner will get a trophy.

Entry fees, stabling arrangements, MCP-charge etc. will be paid in Swiss Francs. Foreign riders are taxable in Zurich with 17% income tax on their prize money and 7,6% VAT on their entry fee. Swiss riders has to charge with 7.6% VAT.

The Organizing Committee has to charge such taxes and all outstanding fees from the eventual prize money.

The prize-money will be paid in CHF (by cheque) after the last competition.

Liability, Insurance

The organizer accepts no liability of any kind and for any reason.
All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses.
They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Event's organization

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters of matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.
All such changes must be reported to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Sec.Gen. of the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

Sunday driving permit

If riders intend to depart on Sunday and the horsebox is over 3.5 tons total weight they will need a Sunday-driving-permit for Switzerland. This must be obtained from traffic office of cost of CHF 35.00. These permits can be obtained through us after receipt of the horsebox registration and customs of departure from Switzerland.
Please hand these over to the secretariat with the fee by *Thursday-evening*.

Final conditions

Once the entry has been made, all riders and owners accept the rules for the CDIY Bern 2004 as well as the conditions of the *organizing committee*.
In case of dispute in the interpretation of this schedule, the English text is law.

Entry right to showground

Participants and owners have to free entrance to the show-ground and the practice Arenas as well as special permits to the stables.
The necessary badges can be obtained at the Accreditation office.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Federation Equestre International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all time the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all times during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare of safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
